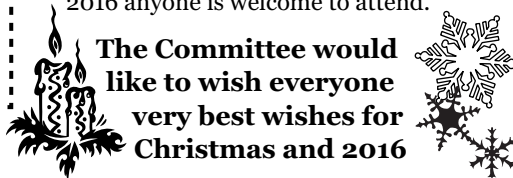
Cutthorpe 2000 committee news

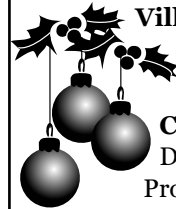
