Cutthorpe Institute Purchase

Brampton Parish Council have agreed to purchase Cutthorpe Institute to continue the use of the facility as a community asset for residents. The purchase will be funded with a mixture of Loans, Parish Council Reserves, Grants, Local Fundraising and Donations. The balance required from Grants, Local Fundraising and Donations is £10,000

The Parish Clerk will apply for grants from various funding providers; fundraising and donations are sought from local organisations and individuals.

Once purchased, the Parish Council will also then need to consider how best to fund the cost of the long standing repairs required to the Institute roof, so fundraising initiatives for this would also be appreciated.

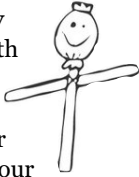


Cutthorpe Festival 2016
