

# Brampton Parish Neighbourhood Plan -Referendum 21st November

For the last 5 years a small, dedicated team has been developing a Neighbourhood Plan for Brampton Parish. It covers the period until 2034 and will be used to determine future developments in the Parish, including planning applications.

Both North East Derbyshire District Council and the Peak District National Park Authority have now passed our Plan but there is one more step that will determine whether it gets formally approved. That is a referendum open to all electors on the role in Brampton Parish. The decision will be made by a simple majority of those voting in a referendum to be held on Thursday, 21st November 2023. PLEASE VOTE!

NEDDC will be sending out the usual cards when a vote is scheduled as well as relevant information about the referendum. Please use your vote at your allocated Polling Station.




We are also considering doing a day of village Open Gardens, if you are willing to be part of this day please let me know, the proposed date is 14th July 2024.
