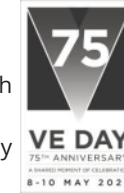

## Cutthorpe and Climate change

Climate change affects us all, John Robinson's Discussion Group had this as the topic for January and is also getting others in the village involved. The following article has been written by John with the aim of getting more action in our community.



"After a small initial meeting comprising of farmers, school teachers and interested persons, followed by it being the topic of January's Discussion Group meeting, we would like to keep you informed of some of the ideas of what we can do in Cutthorpe to help improve the environment and our planet.

Our initial idea is to plant more trees to reduce CO2. The Woodland Trust will happily give us lots of native varieties including a variety of hedging and are currently taking applications for packs of up to 420 tree saplings (20-60cm tall, which can reach an adult's head height in around eight years) to be delivered in November. What we now need, of course, is suitable locations and volunteers to plant and take care of them. The Woodland Trust asks for details of where they are to be planted, which needs to be fully accessible to the public. Other ideas, which are being followed up, include ways individuals could save energy, generating energy from water flowing from Linacre reservoirs and use of solar panels. Also we would like to find alternative ways to reduce waste or use waste to produce energy. Cutthorpe Primary School is keen to get involved perhaps with a wild area to encourage wildlife. Also maybe a scheme for schools to hatch eggs of native birds that have declined in the area.
