



Community Speed Watch

Seven Cutthorpe volunteeers received online training to operate Community Speed Watch sessions in Brampton Parish. Speed Watch is a non-confrontational measurement of traffic speeds designed to remind motorists of the relevant speed limits and hopefully persuade those who might disregard them to reduce their speed. The speed limits are just that, not targets to be achieved or exceeded! It is planned to start operations once the lockdown ends. There will be warning signs indicating that vehicle speeds are being monitored; no vehicles will be stopped but any vehicle being driven significantly above the legal limit will be noted and the driver will receive a warning letter. If repeated occurrences of excess speed are noted the police have the discretion to consider further action. We hope this will encourage safer driving as there is little doubt that too many drive at excess speeds here. Neighbourhood Plan

There will be additional content covering excessive external lighting of properties in the Parish and of establishing zero/low carbon emission standards for any new-build or redevelopment of properties in the Parish.

Local Parking

Concerns about inconsiderate parking have been raised so please bear in mind that:

Soft and Grass verges are easily damaged, any flowers planted there are destroyed and in wet conditions a mud zone is left.

Parking on pavements means disabled and, vulnerable people and parents with pushchairs can be forced into the road. Always allow a 'double buggy' width.

New laws are being brought in that will result in a fine for pavement parking, so get into good habits now.

Possible Recycling Disruption

The Council has just announced new household recycling collection arrangements as their recycling contractor has gone into administration. The Council has therefore moved to in-house recycling collection arrangements and is aiming to maintain services and minimise disruption as far as possible.

The Council will be using its garden waste collection vehicles to maintain recycling services. This means it will not be possible to keep 'inner caddy' paper items separate for a short time. However, these recyclable wastes will be sent to a Material Recycling Facility for sorting. More news will come from the Council as it is available.

Mens Shed

The Cutthorpe Men's Shed, based on the nationwide organisation, is now up and running. Several meetings have taken place, originally socially distanced outdoors and now online. Despite the current lockdown there are 4 projects ongoing:

- A plague is to be created for one of the commemorative trees in the village.
- A group of volunteers is being organised to do the digging work for the wild flower garden.
- A mock up of a soldier silhouette is being created to add to the wild flower garden once completed.
- Refurbishment of the seat around the Coronation tree at the top of Common Lane is being organised.

We have made contact with the community involvement officer of Derbyshire county council who is able to assist with guidance on obtaining grants, and donations of equipment etc,. They have assisted 2 groups recently to start a shed club. Once we find premises or space for premises, we may be able to apply for grants given certain conditions.
