## Dunston Grange building development

A meeting was recently held by the Dunston Grange Residents Action Group with Councillor Simmons to express concerns about the proposed building of another 500 houses on Dunston Road. A wide range of issues and questions were raised including the fact that initial proposals include a primary school and shops but no mention of doctors surgeries, dentists and other crucial infrastructure - It was confirmed that there are no plans for provision of these additional services. Also the impact of the increase in traffic was raised, particularly as Cutthorpe will be on a direct route to the Peak District and beyond and there is already a large development underway.
