# **Ashgate Hospice Winter Appeal**


The Pennine Way in January?? Crazy, but that's when the Montane Spine Race takes place. The distance is 254 miles (410 km), the height climbed is 36286 feet (11060 metres). Competitors have one week to complete the course.

Pete Stott, who lives in The Poplars, Main Road, has walked the route four times, starting in 1963. He's planning a sponsored Pennine Way Walk in January. It will be a "virtual" Pennine Way, using local footpaths, bridleways, lanes and roads. Daily routes will come close to the distances and heights he would tackle on the Pennine Way itself, though that will necessitate extra ascents of Common Lane and Oxton Rakes on some days!

"I'm giving myself a month," says Pete. "I'm planning to walk on 17 days. That's what I'd aim for if I did the actual route in summer. I might need some rest days, which I've never bothered with before. I'm making it an environmentally sound walk, with no transport or accommodation costs, and I'll never be more than 9 km from Ashgate as the crow flies."
